1 Samuel 9:1-2

"Kish was a rich, influential man from the tribe of Benjamin. He was the son of Abiel and grandson of Zeror, from the family of Becorath and the clan of Aphiah. His son Saul was the most handsome man in Israel--head and shoulders taller than anyone else in the land.." 1 Samuel 9:1-2

The human perspective is always only a partial view. The complete picture rests alone with God. The choice of Saul, while God had permitted it, was only the Lord's permissive will in allowing what the people had clamored for in the first place. (1 Samuel 8:19-22).
