1 Samuel 11:6

"When Saul heard their words, the Spirit of God came upon him in power, and he burned with anger." 1 Samuel 11.6 NIV

How often we have been dulled to evil by our constant exposure to it! Wickedness has a way of growing like a plant – first from a small seed until it fully blooms and ripens with the most foul of fruit. Christians who show their displeasure or voice their opinions against evil practices are often shamed into silence with accusations of intolerance or "un-Christ like" attitudes! Nothing could be farther from the truth! "You are the salt of the earth, but if the salt has lost its savor, with what shall it be salted?" (Matthew 5:13)
