2 Kings 7:5 – 11

"And *the four lepers* arose at twilight, to go to the camp of the Syrians... and behold, there was no man there... and they went into one tent and ate and drank and carried from there silver and gold. Then they said to one another, "We are not doing what's right! This is a day of good news, but we are keeping silent... Therefore let's go and tell the King." 2 Kings 7:5-11
