Habakkuk 3:1

"A prayer of Habakkuk, the prophet, upon Shigionoth," Habakkuk 3:1

Do you know what a Shigionoth is? Yes, most likely it was some sort of musical instrument. If so, Habakkuk's prayer may have been in song form. Songs are one of the most powerful forms of prayer. Prophesy and intercession when mingled together and carried aloft by our voice of praise and song, penetrate the heavenlies<sup>1</sup> displacing the forces of darkness with light. Such "high praises of God" literally bind the forces of darkness and renders them impotent enabling the Word of God to gain entrance into the hearers of the hearers! (Psalm 149:6).
