Isaiah 48:16

"Come near to Me, and hear this: I have not spoken in secret from the beginning; from the time that it was, there I AM; and now the Lord GOD, and His Spirit has sent Me." Isaiah 48:16

Clearly this is an Old Testament reference to the Godhead. While the word "Godhead" is never specifically used in the Scriptures – either Old Testament or New Testament – we may at times distinctly see this divine mystery of the triune God or tri-unity of God's blessed Being throughout the Scriptures.
