

Volume 3 The Prophetic Books Isaiah 57:17 – 18

"For the iniquity of his covetousness I was angry and struck him. I hid and was angry, and he went on backsliding in the way of his heart. I have seen his ways and I will heal him, I will also lead him, and restore comforts to him and to his mourners." (Isaiah 57:17 – 18"

Covetousness allows false gods an entrance into our lives. "...covetousness which is idolatry." (Colossians 3:5). To continue a pursuit of such false gods endangers the believer with the evils of those gods. "Ephraim is joined to idols; let him alone." (Hosea 4:17). There is always an exchange to be made.
