Jeremiah 17:5 – 6

"Thus says the LORD, "Cursed be the man that trusts in man, and makes flesh his arm, and whose heart departs from the LORD. For he shall be like the scrub in the desert, and shall not see *even* when good comes; but shall inhabit the parched places in the wilderness, in a salt land *that is* not inhabited." Jeremiah 17:5 - 6

Take a moment and access your dependence upon men rather than upon God. Now, repent wherever it may be necessary. Begin today, this moment, in a new found dependence upon Him – the Source of your life! Finally, thank Him for Your next breath!
