Then Job answered and said, "Truly I know it is so, but how can a man be righteous before God?" Job 9:1-2

It does not take a spiritual giant or a prophet to understand this truth. But it is open only for the honest of heart. Our good deeds, no matter how profuse; our sacrificial giving, no matter how selfless; our words, no matter how kind – all fall short of the glory of God! Man simply cannot measure himself before a righteous and just God. "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we do all fade as a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind have taken us away."
