"Then Job answers, "I have heard many such things; Miserable comforters are you all! ... I also could speak as you do. If your soul were in my soul's place, I could heap up words against you, and shake my head at you, but *instead* I would strengthen you with my mouth, and *I would* comfort you with *my lips* and *I would* relieve your grief." Job 16:1-5

How easily we make judgments on other people! Our words strike hard against them and instead of comfort or encouragement we may offer well meaning, but non-the-less, verbally abusive words. Job is correct, our words should bring peace not accusations; help not more grief! "Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer every man."
