Job 42:8 – 9

“... the Lord said to Eliphaz... “Take for yourselves seven bulls and seven rams, go to My servant Job, and offer up for yourselves a burnt offering; and My servant Job shall pray for you. For I will accept him, lest I deal with you according to your folly; because you have not spoken of Me what is right, as My servant Job has.” So Eliphaz and Bildad... and Zophar went and did as the Lord commanded them; for the Lord had accepted Job.” Job 42:8 – 9
