Job 2:11 – 13

"Now when Job's three friends heard of all this adversity that had come upon him, each one came from is own place – Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zephor the Naamathite – f or they had made an appointment together to come and mourn with him, and to comfort him." ...
