Jonah 1:4 – 5

"But the LORD sent a great wind into the sea, and there was a mighty tempest in the sea, so that the ship was in danger of being broken. Then the mariners where afraid and cried out to their gods..." Jonah 1:4-5

This was a serious storm! The sailors are terrified – they should be – their ship is the focus of the fury of the storm and they instinctively know it. Jonah's sin has endangered these innocent men, yet the LORD of the Harvest, ever the Great Conservationist, uses this moment of these sailor's felt need, to speak to their hearts condition concerning eternal matters.
