"Give ear to my words, O LORD, consider my meditation. Hearken unto the voice of my cry, my King, and my God, for unto You will I pray. My voice shall You hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto You, and will look up." Psalm 5:1-3
