Psalm 79:8

"Let Your tender mercies speedily meet us; for we are brought very low." Psalm 79:8

In the midst of trouble we are bid to cry out for mercy. But the Holy Spirit would lift our expectations beyond the common mercies one may encounter from day to day. He invites us to call for mercies that are tender. Mercy such as a mother may offer her child that has fallen and hurt his knee.
