Psalm 113:7 - 9

"He raises up the poor out of the dust, and lifts the needy out of the dunghill that He may set them with princes, even the princes of His people. He makes the barren women to keep house, and to be a joyful mother of children. Praise the LORD." Psalm 113:7-9
