Psalm 116:12 – 14

"What shall I render unto the LORD for all His benefits toward me? I will take the cup of salvation, and call upon the name of the LORD. I will pay my vows unto the LORD, now in the presence of all His people." Psalm 116:12 - 14

Have you ever given serious consideration to this question? Of course you have. "How can I give back to the Lord for all He's done for me? What could I possibly give back to Him that would be of equal value? Is it even possible?"
