

Volume 2 Books of Poetry Psalm 143:1 – 4

"Hear my prayer, O LORD; listen to my plea! Answer me because You are faithful and righteous. Don't bring Your servant to trial! Compared to You, no one is perfect. My enemy has chased me. He has knocked me to the ground. He forces me to live in darkness like those in the grave. I am losing all hope; I am paralyzed with fear." Psalm 143:1 – 4 NLT

"For the glory of Your name, O LORD, save me... bring me out of distress... In Your unfailing love... destroy my foes, for I am Your servant." (Psalm 143:11 – 12 NLT).
