"How can we possess our promised land?" Deuteronomy 1:28 paraphrased

Be careful! A man's discouraged heart can infect others with faith robbing words and attitudes. Words of murmuring and complaint, while maybe not intentional, do have a harmful effect and they do have a diabolical origin. We must both guard our own hearts from the infection of unbelieving words. We must also not allow our desire to comfort the discouraged cause us to drop our guard enabling their unbelief to penetrate our own hearts. Discouragement is an inheritance thief!
