Exodus 4:24-25

"And it came to pass at the encampment, that the LORD met him and sought to kill him, then Zapporah...." Exodus 4:24-25

We are never wise to compare ourselves with other servants of the Lord. For whenever we compare ourselves among ourselves we always come up short, and that will always work to defeat the genuine purpose of the Master for our lives. (2 Corinthians 10:12). It doesn't really matter what the other fellow does, now does it? "Peter, seeing him, said to Jesus, "But Lord, what about this man?" (John 21:21) Our Lord's response to Peter that day is the same response He whispers to us today, "What is that to you? You follow Me!" (John 21:22)
