Ezra 1:1-3

"Now...the LORD stirred up the spirit of Cyrus..." Ezra 1:1-3

"Now in the first year of Cyrus, King of Persia, so that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah the prophet might be fulfilled, the LORD stirred up the spirit of Cyrus... that he made a proclamation... and put it in writing... to build *Yahweh* a house at Jerusalem... then the father's of Judah... and priests... with all those whose spirits God had stirred up to go build the house of the LORD..." Ezra 1:1-3

No worries, the LORD is always alert and active watching over His word. (Jeremiah 1:12). As He will fulfill His word to the nations, He will fulfill His word to you!
